



Bristol: Thursday 8 & Friday 9 June 2017

For Assembly Bristol, one of five a-n Assembly events taking place across the UK during May and June this year, a-n have devised a programme of events with Bristol-based artist Julie McCalden.

The Assembly, which takes barriers to practice as a point of departure, was shaping up nicely, when the snap election was called right smack bang in the middle of it.

Embracing this serendipitous straddling, artists are invited to descend upon the Brunswick Club — where the

majority of events will be hosted — for a programme artist-led discussions and unconventional workshops. Based in St Pauls with its skittle alleys, dance hall, bars and lounges, the Brunswick Club is being inhabited by over thirty artists, performers, film-makers and curators for a 9-month project.

Complemented by a-n led professional development sessions, a post-election breakfast and a feast for the masses will provide social opportunities for celebrating, commiserating and letting off steam.

Proposal for a Guide for Art Parents — strategies to continue thinking and making as a parent

The issue of starting a family wasn't covered at art school — or if it was it was derided. 'There is no more sombre enemy of good art than the pram in the hall' because, it is assumed, you can't be devoted to your practice and your child at the same time.

If you are wondering how to continue your practice whilst being a parent, how you will manage childcare or cope with limited time and diminished access - not to mention the gender divide - then you are not alone.

Art parents need strategies of care and systems of support. Let's talk about it.

Beginning with a 'coffee morning' where participants can get acquainted over coffee and cake the session will include presentations from independent producer and horticulturist Jane Porter, who will share her project **Bring Your Baby**, live artist **Liz Clarke** who will introduce her practice and artist and facilitator **Frances Bossom** who will give a short presentation about feminist art practices in the 60s, 70s and 80s alongside current models. After more cake, Frances will facilitate a practical workshop and discussion exploring what a Guide for Art Parents could be.

Part of a-n's ongoing practical support for artists, this workshop has been designed in response to our **Paying Artists** campaign which identified lack of confidence and training in negotiation as a barrier to artists achieving fair payment. This workshop will help equip participants with the communication skills to empower them to advocate for their work and value.

Delivered by **Rivca Rubin** — whose areas of expertise are in communication and leadership development, conflict resolution and change management, creative thinking and future visioning, this workshop will help you to create clarity around motivations, expectations and outcomes and discuss how to create the right conditions to communicate. You will also explore the role of positive language and action, how to tactfully challenge those you disagree with, and how you can find common ground — knowing when to compromise and find a mutually agreeable conclusion.

Participants will also receive copies of the recently launched Exhibition Payment

Guidance and the Artist-Led Manifesto which was launched alongside the guidance to take into consideration the different economies artist-led activities operate in.
